**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act banning the use of tear gas by law enforcement.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 116K, as added by chapter 253 of the acts of 2020, the  
3 following section:-

4 SECTION 116L. (a) No law enforcement officer, law enforcement agency or department  
5 shall purchase, obtain, use or allow to be used for law enforcement purposes on any person, a  
6 chemical or substance that can produce rapidly in humans, sensory irritation or disabling  
7 physical effects within a short time of exposure. Examples of such substance include “tear gas”  
8 or “CS gas”.

9 (b) Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a criminal fine of \$5,000.
