## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act further regulating the sale of alcoholic beverages in the city of Somerville.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. The first sentence of the first paragraph of section 3 of chapter 381 of the
- 2 acts of 2012 is hereby amended by striking out the number "12" and inserting in place thereof
- 3 the following number: 27.
- 4 SECTION 2. The first sentence of the first paragraph of section 3 of chapter 381 of the
- 5 acts of 2012 is hereby further amended by striking out the number "12" and inserting in place
- 6 thereof the following number: 32.
- 7 SECTION 3. (a) Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
- 8 licensing commission of the city of Somerville may grant 12 additional licenses for the sale of all
- 9 alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said chapter 138 and 6
- 10 additional licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant
- 11 to said section 12 of said chapter 138, to operators and locations to be determined by the
- 12 licensing commission in accordance with this section. The licenses shall be subject to this section
- 13 and all of said chapter 138 except said section 17.

- (b) The licensing commission of the city of Somerville shall restrict the licensesauthorized by this section in the following manner:
- (i) 2 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises and 1
  license for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises granted pursuant to
  this subsection shall be restricted to entities within the Transformative Areas of the Inner Belt,
  Brickbottom and Boynton Yards as bounded by the city of Boston boundary line, the city of
  Somerville boundary line, Washington street east of McGrath Highway, McGrath Highway,
  Somerville avenue, Webster avenue and Prospect street.
- 22 (ii) 10 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises and 5 licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises granted pursuant to 23 this subsection shall be restricted to entities within the Enhancement Areas as defined by the areas within Union Square bounded by School street, Bow street, Washington street, train line 25 and Somerville avenue; Davis Square as bounded by Willow avenue, Orchard street, Jay street, Simpson avenue, the city of Cambridge boundary line and Morrison avenue; Ball Square as 27 bounded by the city of Medford boundary line, Powder House circle, Broadway street, Cedar 28 street and the train line; Gilman Square as bounded by Dartmouth street, train line, Stickney 29 avenue and Walnut street; Lowell street as bounded by Vernon street, Albion street and Lowell 30 street; Northwest Somerville as bounded by the city of Medford boundary line, Mystic Valley 31 parkway and Boston avenue; Teele Square as bounded by Broadway street, Paulina street and Endicott avenue; Broadway as bounded from Main street to the city of Boston boundary line; 33 Magoun Square as bounded by William street, the city of Medford boundary line, Medford 34 street, Norwood avenue and Broadway street; Highland avenue as bounded by Medford street

- and Willow avenue; Somerville avenue as bounded by Porter street and School street; and
   Beacon street as bounded by the city of Cambridge and Oxford street .
- 38 (c) The licenses assigned to the Transformative Areas and Enhancement Areas shall not be sold or transferred by the licensee. If a licensee terminates or fails to renew its license under this section, the license shall revert to the licensing commission. The licensing commission of the 40 city of Somerville shall not approve the transfer of a license granted pursuant to this section to a 41 location outside of the city's Transformative Areas and Enhancement Areas but it may grant a license to a new applicant within the Transformative Areas or Enhancement Areas if the 43 applicant files with the licensing commission a letter from the department of revenue and a letter 44 45 from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid. A 46 license granted pursuant to this section shall be clearly marked on its face "Transformative Areas 47 or Enhancement Areas Only". 48
- (d) If a license granted pursuant to this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use it shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing commission and the licensing commission may then grant the license to a new applicant at a location within the Transformative Areas or Enhancement Areas under the same conditions specified in this section.
- SECTION 4. (a) Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the licensing commission of the city of Somerville may grant 4 additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said chapter 138 and 1 additional license for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises

- pursuant to said section 12 of said chapter 138. The licenses shall be subject to all of said chapter138 except said section 17.
- (b) Once issued, the licensing commission shall not approve the transfer of a license granted pursuant to this section to any other location but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files with the licensing commission a letter from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid.
- (c) If a license granted pursuant to this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use, it shall be returned physically, with all legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing commission and the licensing commission may then grant the license to a new applicant at the same location under the same conditions as specified in this section.
- SECTION 5. (a) Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
  licensing commission of the city of Somerville may grant 15 additional licenses for the sale of all
  alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said chapter 138 and 7
  additional licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages licenses to be drunk on the premises
  pursuant to said section 12 of said chapter 138, to operators and locations to be determined by
  licensing commission in accordance with this section. The licenses shall be subject to this section
  and all of said chapter 138 except said section 17.
- 77 (b) The licensing commission of the city of Somerville shall restrict the licenses 78 authorized by this section in the following manner:

- (i) 5 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises and 2
  licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises granted pursuant to
  this subsection shall be restricted to entities within the Transformative Areas of the Inner Belt,
  Brickbottom and Boynton Yards as bounded by the city of Boston boundary line, the city of
  Somerville boundary line, Washington street east of McGrath Highway, McGrath Highway,
  Somerville avenue, Webster avenue and Prospect street.
- 85 (ii) 10 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises and 5 licenses for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises granted pursuant to this subsection shall be restricted to entities within the Enhancement Areas as defined by the 87 areas within Union Square bounded by School street, Bow street, Washington street, train line 88 and Somerville avenue; Davis Square as bounded by Willow avenue, Orchard street, Jay street, 89 Simpson avenue, the city of Cambridge boundary line and Morrison avenue; Ball Square as 90 bounded by the city of Medford boundary line, Powder House circle, Broadway street, Cedar 91 street and the train line; Gilman Square as bounded by Dartmouth street, train line, Stickney 92 avenue and Walnut street; Lowell street as bounded by Vernon street, Albion street and Lowell 93 street; Northwest Somerville as bounded by the city of Medford boundary line, Mystic Valley 94 parkway and Boston avenue; Teele Square as bounded by Broadway street, Paulina street and 96 Endicott avenue; Broadway as bounded from Main street to the city of Boston boundary line; Magoun Square as bounded by William street, the city of Medford boundary line, Medford street, Norwood avenue and Broadway street; Highland avenue as bounded by Medford street 98 99 and Willow avenue; Somerville avenue as bounded by Porter street and School street; and 100 Beacon street as bounded by the city of Cambridge and Oxford street.

- 101 (c) The licenses assigned to the Transformative Areas and Enhancement Areas shall not be sold or transferred by the licensee. If a licensee terminates or fails to renew its license under 102 103 this section, the license shall revert to the licensing commission. The licensing commission of the city of Somerville shall not approve the transfer of a license granted pursuant to this section to a 104 location outside of the city's Transformative Areas and Enhancement Areas but it may grant a 105 106 license to a new applicant within the Transformative Areas or Enhancement Areas if the applicant files with the licensing commission a letter from the department of revenue and a letter 107 from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing 108 109 with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid. A license granted pursuant to this section shall be clearly marked on its face "Transformative Areas or Enhancement Areas Only". 111
- (d) If a license granted pursuant to this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use it shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing commission and the licensing commission may then grant the license to a new applicant at a location within the Transformative Areas or Enhancement Areas under the same conditions specified in this section.
- SECTION 6. (a) Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the licensing commission of the city of Somerville may grant 4 additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said chapter 138 and 1 additional license for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to said section 12 of said chapter 138. The licenses shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except said section 17.

- (b) Once issued, the licensing commission shall not approve the transfer of a license granted pursuant to this section to any other location but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files with the licensing commission a letter from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid.
- (c) If a license granted pursuant to this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use, it shall be returned physically, with all legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing commission and the licensing commission may then grant the license to a new applicant at the same location under the same conditions as specified in this section.
- SECTION 7. The administrative fee charged by the city of Somerville for such licenses shall be the same amount as the administrative fee charged by the city for existing licenses granted for the respective category for such licenses. The licenses granted under this section shall be subject to all applicable ordinances of the city.
- SECTION 8. Sections 1, 3 and 4 shall take effect upon passage.
- SECTION 9. Sections 2 shall take effect on January 1, 2019 or upon the issuance of all licenses as allocated under section 1 of this act.
- SECTION 10. Section 5 shall take effect on January 1, 2019 or upon the issuance of all licenses as allocated under section 3 of this act.
- SECTION 11. Section 6 shall take effect on January 1, 2019 or upon the issuance of all licenses as allocated under section 4 of this act.
