# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand and Nine

## An Act relative to the provision of health insurance and other benefits in the Town of Phillipston

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the actions of  
2 the Town of Phillipston and its Board of Selectmen since acceptance by the Town in 1966 and/or the vote  
3 of Town Meeting under Article 45 of the 1986 Annual Town Meeting warrant to provide insurance and  
4 benefits authorized by Section 10 of Chapter 32B of the General Laws, and all actions taken pursuant  
5 thereto, are hereby ratified, validated and confirmed as if the Town of Phillipston had properly voted to  
6 approve the question set forth in Section 10 of said Chapter 32B in accordance with law, and further, the  
7 Town of Phillipston is hereby authorized to continue to provide such insurance and benefits under  
8 Chapter 32B of the General Laws as if the voters of the Town had properly approved the question set  
9 forth in Section 10 of said Chapter 32B, provided, however, that such actions are otherwise taken in  
10 accordance with the requirements of said Chapter 32B.
- 11 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
