An Act authorizing the town of Clinton to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. (a) Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the  
2 local licensing authority of the town of Clinton may grant an additional license for the sale of all  
3 alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 15 of said chapter 138 to  
4 Ranna, Inc. located at 220 High street in the town of Clinton. The license shall be subject to all  
5 of said chapter 138 except said section 17.

6           (b) The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license granted under this  
7 act to any other location but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the  
8 applicant files with the licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue and a letter  
9 from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing  
10 with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid.

11           (c) If a licensee terminates or fails to renew a license granted under this act or any such  
12 license is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use, it shall be returned physically, with all of the  
13 legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority, and the  
14 licensing authority may then grant the license to a new applicant at the same location under the  
15 same conditions as specified in this act.

16           (d) The license granted under this act shall be issued within 1 year after the effective date  
17 of this act; provided, however, that a license originally granted within that time period may be  
18 granted to a new applicant under subsections (b) or (c) thereafter.

19           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
