An Act relative to the service of civil process.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 92 of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004 Official  
2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking, in line 13, the words “two thousand, five hundred”, and  
3 inserting in place thereof the following words:-

4 “twenty-five thousand”

5 SECTION 2. Said section 92 of said chapter 41 is hereby further amended by striking, in lines 14  
6 and 15, the words “two thousand, five hundred”, and inserting in place thereof the following  
7 words:-

8 “twenty-five thousand”
