Hunt and others (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that the city of Boston be authorized set the speed limit to 20 miles per hour on public ways in thickly settled or business districts in said city. In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act concerning speed limits in the city of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding sections 17 and 18 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, or
2 any general or special law, or regulation to the contrary, the speed limit shall be 20 miles per
3 hour on public ways in a thickly settled or business district, as defined in section 1 of said
4 chapter 90, and 15 miles per hour within a school zone, established by the city of Boston
5 pursuant to section 2 of chapter 85 of the General Laws, unless the speed limit is otherwise
6 posted pursuant to said section 18 of said chapter 90. This act shall apply to public ways subject
7 to the control of the city of Boston.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
