# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act establishing a sick leave bank for William Horohoe, an employee of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the

2 Massachusetts Department of Transportation shall establish a sick leave bank for William

3 Horohoe, an employee of the department. Any employee of the department may voluntarily

4 contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by William

5 Horohoe. If William Horohoe terminates employment with the department or requests to

6 dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the

7 extended illness leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the

8 illness or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by

9 the department.

10 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
