Finegold and Linda Dean Campbell for legislation to create an office of data protection, cybersecurity, and privacy; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 118) of Michael J. Finn relative to electronic systems designed to monitoring sales of certain products containing pseudoephedrine; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 130) of Joan Meschino, Paul F. Tucker and others for legislation to establish a comprehensive statewide policy concerning streaming entertainment services and the recovery of municipal costs for the management and maintenance of digital infrastructure, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4892) ought to be adopted.

3 and study of Senate document numbered 51 and House documents numbered 118 and 130,
4 relative to advanced information technology, the internet and cybersecurity.

5 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study
6 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
7 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
8 on or before December 31, 2022.
