By Mr. Stanley of Waltham, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 494) of Thomas M. Stanley and others for legislation to exempt employees of a public school districts from fees associated with background checks. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act Relative to National Background Check Fees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 38R of Chapter 71 of the general laws as amended by Chapter 77 of
- 2 the Acts of 2013, is hereby further amended adding the following new paragraph:-
- Notwithstanding this section, employees of a public school district shall not be charged a
- 4 fee related to this section; provided further, that the Commonwealth shall assume all financial
- 5 obligations required for the operation and administration of said fingerprint-based criminal
- 6 background check related to the employees of public school districts.

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- 8 SECTION 2. Employees of a public school district who have paid a fee pursuant to
- 9 Section 38R of Chapter 71 prior to the effective date of this act, shall have the cost of said fee
- 10 credited toward future fees related to educator licenses authorized by Chapter 71 and Chapter 74
- 11 of the general laws; provided further, that the Commonwealth is hereby authorized and directed
- 12 to reimburse employees and retired employees of a public school district, who are or were not

- 13 employed in positions requiring state licensure or who have left employment covered by this
- 14 section and are not subject to educator license renewal, for the cost of said fee paid prior to the
- 15 effective date of this act.
