**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to providing consumer protection in the licensing of appraisers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8G of chapter 26 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2012
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the first paragraph in its entirety and inserting the
3 following new paragraph in place thereof:-

4 “There shall be in the division of insurance an auto damage appraiser licensing board,
5 hereinafter called the board, consisting of seven persons. The governor shall appoint two
6 members who shall be affiliated with the auto body repair industry and two members who shall
7 be affiliated with insurance companies writing casualty insurance within the commonwealth.
8 The attorney general shall appoint one representative of her office and shall appoint one
9 additional person, unaffiliated with her office, an auto body shop or an insurance company, to
10 represent consumers. The commissioner of insurance shall appoint one person who shall not be

11 affiliated with either the auto body industry or the insurance industry and who shall be the
12 chairman of the board. No member shall serve for more than 2 consecutive and complete 3-year
13 terms. As the term of the office of a member expires, a successor shall be appointed in like
14 manner for a term of 3 years. A vacancy on the board shall be filled within 60 days from the date
15 of the vacancy.”
