In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to increasing education funding.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 23K of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby

2 amended by striking out Section 64 in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the following:

3 "Section 64. There shall be established and set up on the books of the commonwealth a 4 fund to be known as the Education Fund. The fund shall be credited with any monies transferred 5 under section 59 and all monies credited to or transferred to the fund from any other fund or 6 source. Expenditures from the fund shall be subject to appropriation; provided, however, that 35 7 per cent of the funds received shall be appropriated for the purposes of higher education to 8 supplement, not offset, any reduction in the general appropriation act from the previous fiscal 9 year; and provided further, that any expenditures from the fund for K-12 education shall be used 10 to supplement, and not offset, any reduction in line-item 7061-0008 of the general appropriation

- 11 act from the previous fiscal year's general appropriation act; and provided further, that all
- 12 registration and renewal fees from online gaming, daily fantasy sports, and online sports betting
- 13 shall be deposited into the Education Fund.
