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### HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,

The committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 465) of Erika Uytterhoeven and Lindsay N. Sabadosa for legislation to regulate cottage foods; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 846) of Bruce J. Ayers relative to directing the Department of Fish and Game to study the feasibility of re-purposing the former Moon Island Sewage Treatment Plant for use as a fish and shellfish farm; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 862) of Nicholas A. Boldyga, Jacob R. Oliveira and others relative to the regulation and availability of cottage foods; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 908) of Dylan A. Fernandes, David M. Rogers and Sarah K. Peake relative to recreation on private tidelands; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 945) of Daniel J. Hunt relative to Department of Conservation and Recreation retained revenue; and the joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 981) of Sarah K. Peake and Julian Cyr (by vote of the town) that the director of the office of fishing and boating access be authorized to issue an annual general permit to the town of Orleans to permit swimming from the state-owned properties located on Bakers Pond road, reports the accompanying Order (House, No. 5236) ought to be adopted.

2 authorized to sit during a recess of the General Court to make an investigation and study of  
3 House documents numbered 465, 846, 862, 908, 945 and 981, relative to cottage foods, state  
4 properties and other related matters.

5            Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study  
6 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
7 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives  
8 on or before December 31, 2022.
