## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to neurodiversity education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 71 of the Acts of 2021 are hereby amended by adding the following section after section 98.
- 3 Section 99. (a) the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, in consultation
- 4 with the Department of Early Education and Care, shall, subject to appropriation, issue
- 5 guidelines to assist districts in developing k-12 education on neurodiversity.
- 6 (b) There is hereby established a commission to study and make recommendations on
- 7 neurodiversity education in early childhood, elementary, and secondary public school education.
- 8 The commission shall consist of 9 members; the secretary of health and human services, or a
- 9 designee, who shall serve as chair; 1 member of the house of representatives, to be appointed by
- 10 the speaker of the house; 1 member of the Senate, to be appointed by the president of the senate;
- 11 3 members to be appointed by the governor, 2 of whom shall be neurodiverse adults, 1 of whom
- shall be a representative from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, 1 of

- whom shall be a representative from the Department of Early Education and Care, and a
  representative of the Massachusetts Teachers Association.
- The commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the governor and the clerks of the house of representatives and the senate, including any recommendations for legislation or regulations, within 4 months of the effective date of this act.
