Eldridge for legislation to establish the family caregiver tax credit; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1823) of Cynthia Stone Creem for legislation relative to senior citizen property taxes; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2846) of Tackey Chan for legislation to provide an income tax exemption for families caring for their elderly relatives at home; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2888) of Carolyn C. Dykema and others relative to the senior property tax deferral program; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2922) of Kenneth I. Gordon for legislation to authorize the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency to establish a senior property tax deferral revolving fund; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2979) of David Paul Linsky and Michelle M. DuBois relative to establishing a family caregiver tax credit; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3035) of Alice Hanlon Peisch relative to tax basis rules for property acquired from decedents; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3043) of David M. Rogers and others for legislation to establish the family caregiving tax credit; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3090) of Tommy Vitolo, David M. Rogers and others relative to property tax deferrals for certain senior citizens, reports the accompanying order (House, No. 5352) ought to be adopted [Senator Fattman dissents].

6 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
7 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
8 on or before December 31, 2022.
