An Act relative to returning prescription medication to pharmacies..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2002 Official
2	Edition, is hereby amended by striking out section 25I and inserting in place thereof the
3	following section:-

Section 25I. The commissioner shall promulgate regulations requiring that either a
resident or consultant pharmacist in a health care facility shall return to the pharmacy from
which it was purchased all unused medication; provided that such medication is sealed in
unopened, individually packaged units and within the recommended period of shelf life, and
provided that such medication is not a schedule I or II controlled substance as defined in Chapter
94C. Such pharmacies shall accept all such unused medications regardless of whether such

10 medications are included on any list of unit-dose drugs issued by the department or the division 11 of medical assistance. Any rules and regulations issued by the commissioner shall permit the 12 pharmacy to which such medication is returned to restock and redistribute such medication, and 13 shall be required to reimburse or credit the purchaser for any such returned medication.
