## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to routine childhood immunizations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 15 of chapter 76 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by striking out the third paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following
- 3 2 paragraphs:-
- 4 All schools, whether public, private, or charter, that provide education to children in any
- 5 combination of grade levels from kindergarten to grade 12, inclusive, shall annually report to the
- 6 department total numbers of children who are successfully immunized in accordance with
- 7 section 15 of chapter 76 and who are exempted from immunization requirements. The
- 8 department shall designate the methodology for reporting.
- 9 The department shall annually publish and make publicly available aggregate
- immunizations and exemptions data for each school and school district, provided, that publishing
- and making publicly available such data shall not be required if it would result in disclosure of
- personal information as defined in section 1 of chapter 93H or otherwise violate applicable
