Proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution relative to voting by qualified voters of the Commonwealth who are also poll workers.

A majority of all the members elected to the Senate and House of Representatives, in joint session, hereby declares it to be expedient to alter the Constitution by the adoption of the following Article of Amendment, to the end that it may become a part of the Constitution [if similarly agreed to in a joint session of the next General Court and approved by the people at the state election next following]:

### ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

1 Article XLV of the articles of amendment to the Constitution, as amended by Articles  
2 LXXVI and CV of said articles of amendment, is hereby annulled and the following is adopted  
3 in place thereof:-  
4 The general court shall have power to provide by law for voting, in the choice of any officer to  
5 be elected or upon any question submitted at an election, by qualified voters of the  
6 commonwealth who, at the time of such an election, are unable to cast their votes in person at the  
7 polling places on the day on which such an election is to be held, due to obligations as poll  
8 workers, may vote prior to the date of such election.
