By Representatives Velis of Westfield and Kane of Shrewsbury, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 631) of John C. Velis and others for legislation to establish a special commission (including members of the General Court) to study the financial abuse of elders. Elder Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act establishing a commission to study the financial abuse of elders.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) The Massachusetts General Court shall initiate a commission to study
- 2 and draft policies to combat the financial abuse of elders in the Commonwealth.
- 3 (1) Said Commission shall have three members of the Massachusetts House of
- 4 Representatives, two appointed by the Speaker of the House and one appointed by the Minority
- 5 Leader;
- 6 (2) Said Commission shall have three members of the Massachusetts Senate, two
- 7 appointed by the President of the Senate and one appointed by the Minority Leader;
- 8 (3) Said commission shall have two attorneys, admitted to the Massachusetts Bar,
- 9 who specialize in elder and estate law;

- 10 (4) Said Commission shall have a representative from an advocacy group, operating
 11 in Massachusetts, which has a history of advocating for the interests of the elder population in
 12 the Commonwealth;
- 13 (5) Said Commission shall have two representatives who are employed by Councils 14 on Aging in the Commonwealth or any organization responsible for administering protective 15 services to elders in the Commonwealth; and
- 16 (6) Said Commission shall have a representative from an association or advocacy 17 group, operating in Massachusetts, which has a history of advocating on behalf of the real estate 18 industry.
 - (7) Said Commission shall have a representative from an association or advocacy group, operating in Massachusetts, which has a background in the financial services industry
- 21 (b) The commission will specifically study

- 22 (1) The economic impact and mechanisms of financial abuse on those over age 60 in 23 the Commonwealth;
- 24 (2) The lending and refinancing practices of companies who target customers above 25 the age of 60;
- 26 (3) Exploitative transfers of real estate or other valuable property from dependent 27 elders to fiduciaries for significantly less than market value;
- 28 (4) Fraudulent or deceptive schemes that target elderly persons in the Commonwealth 29 through telemarketing, the internet, or other means; and

- 30 (5) Any other form of elder financial abuse.
- 31 (c) Said commission shall file a report that includes policy recommendations prevent
- 32 or better protect elders from financial abuse. They shall file their report with the clerk of either
- chamber, as well as the Chairmen of the Joint Committee on Elder Affairs and the Joint
- Committee on Financial Services, no later than December 31st, 2019.
