The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act concerning disposable menstrual products in schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Chapter 71 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby amended by adding
2 at the end thereof the following section 68A:--

3 Section 2. For purposes of this section, “disposable menstrual products” means products
4 including, but not limited to, tampons and sanitary napkins for use in connection with the
5 menstrual cycle.

6 Section 3. All elementary and secondary public schools in the Commonwealth serving
7 students in any grade from grade six through grade twelve shall provide disposable menstrual
8 products in the restrooms of such school building or buildings. Such products shall be provided
9 at no charge to students. Such amount may be adjusted from time to time based on utilization.
10 School districts shall work to ensure that such products shall be available in a convenient manner
11 that does not stigmatize any student seeking such product.

12 Section 4. This act shall take effect on August 1, 2022.
