An Act relative to campaign finance reform.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 55 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 9A, as  
2 appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, the following section:-

3 Section 9A ½. (a) As used in this section, the following terms shall, unless the context  
4 clearly requires otherwise, have the following meanings:-

5 “Merchant account”, an electronic payment processor that enables a person to accept  
6 credit and debit card transactions online for contributions.

7 “Person”, an individual, candidate or political committee, or person acting on behalf of an  
8 individual, candidate or political committee.

9           “Third-party payment processor”, an online service in which payments for contributions  
10 to a person are made to the processor’s merchant account rather than to the person’s own  
11 merchant account.

12           (b) If a contribution to a person is made through a third-party payment processor, the  
13 third-party payment processor shall automatically transfer the contribution to the designated  
14 campaign account of the person.

15           (c) The third-party payment processor shall convey to the person information on  
16 contributions received in accordance with section 2 on a weekly basis.
