The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act providing pre-k education for 4 year-old children in gateway communities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 13 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 13 the 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 13A. (a) The board and department shall develop a program for universal pre-
- 4 kindergarten education in gateway municipalities, as defined in section 3A of chapter 23A,
- 5 which shall be available to all children ages 4 and older (and may be made available to children
- 6 ages 3 and older) who reside in a gateway municipality and would be eligible for free or reduced
- 7 price lunch if the child attended a public school.
- 8 (b) In developing the program, the board and department shall: (i) establish a
- 9 standardized pre-kindergarten curriculum for all program participants; (ii) partner with current
- providers of pre-kindergarten services in gateway communities; and (iii) focus on the specific

- 11 cognitive, linguistic, social, emotional, cultural and physical needs of the children in each
 12 gateway municipality.
- 13 (c) Each child who qualifies for the universal pre-kindergarten program established by
 14 this section shall be counted as a student of the school district in which the child attends the pre15 kindergarten program, and shall be included as such a student for the purposes of calculating that
 16 district's funding pursuant to chapter 70.
- 17 (d) The board shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the requirements of this section.
