In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to eligibility for state group health insurance.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 2(e) of Chapter 32A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004
- 2 Official Edition, is amended in line 94 by inserting after the word “hours” the following:
- 3 or faculty who teach the equivalent of at least two three or more- credit courses per semester or
- 4 four three or more- credit courses per calendar year at one of more state higher education
- 5 institutions, including a division of continuing education, regardless of funding source, including
- 6 but not limited to subsidiary account CC, and regardless of the term of employment
