An Act relative to the credible service of Ray Silva..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the state board of
- 2 retirement shall credit Ray Silva, a former clinical director in the department of youth services,
- 3 with the 3 months of additional creditable service that would have made him eligible to receive
- 4 an ordinary veteran's disability retirement allowance under section 6 of chapter 32 of the General
- 5 Laws at the time of his death. The state board of retirement shall pay to his widow the survivor
- 6 allowance to which she would have been entitled had he been credited with this additional
- 7 service and found eligible to receive an ordinary veteran's disability retirement.
- 8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
