An Act eliminating the gasoline tax to state agencies and municipalities \Box .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 64A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- 3 Any sale of fuel by a distributor to the commonwealth, any state agency or any municipality or
- 4 its agencies shall be exempt from the tax per gallon contained in this chapter.
