An Act setting apart the third Saturday of the month of October as Massachusetts Minutemen and Militia Day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 15LLLLL the  
2 following section:-

3       Section 15 MMMMM The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the  
4 third Saturday in October of each year as Massachusetts Minutemen and Militia Day to honor the  
5 memory of our Forefathers of the Revolutionary War and those who support and preserve the  
6 autonomy of all companies, regiments, units and organizations who promote the ideals of  
7 patriotism and love of the country and recommending that said day be observed in an appropriate  
8 manner by the people.
