The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to providing a false address at arrest.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 34A of chapter 268 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the
- 3 following sentence:- Whoever knowingly and willfully furnishes a false name, Social Security
- 4 number, date of birth, home address, mailing address or phone number, or other information as
- 5 may be requested for the purposes of establishing the person's identity, to a law enforcement
- 6 officer or law enforcement official following an arrest shall be punished by a fine of not more
- 7 than \$1,000 or by imprisonment in a house of correction for not more than 1 year or by both such
- 8 fine and imprisonment.
