The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to abusive practices to change sexual orientation and gender identity in minors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official
- 2 addition, is hereby amended by adding following new section:-
- 3 Section 264. (a) Definitions.
- 4 For the purposes of this section, "licensed professional" means any licensed medical,
- 5 mental health, or human service professional licensed under Chapter 112, including any
- 6 psychologist, psychiatrist, social worker, psychiatric nurse, allied mental health and human
- 7 services professional, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed rehabilitation counselor,
- 8 licensed mental health counselor, licensed educational psychologist, or any of their respective

- 9 interns or trainees, or any other person designated or licensed as a mental health or human
 0 service professional under Massachusetts law or regulation.
- The term "sexual orientation" shall mean having an orientation for or being identified as having an orientation for heterosexuality, bisexuality, or homosexuality.
- 13 The term "Gender identity" shall mean a person's gender-related identity, appearance or behavior, whether or not that gender-related identity, appearance or behavior is different from 14 that traditionally associated with the person's physiology or assigned sex at birth. Gender-related 15 16 identity may be shown by providing evidence including, but not limited to, medical history, care or treatment of the gender-related identity, consistent and uniform assertion of the gender-related 17 identity or any other evidence that the gender-related identity is sincerely held as part of a 18 19 person's core identity; provided, however, that gender-related identity shall not be asserted for 20 any improper purpose.
- "Sexual orientation and gender identity change efforts" means any practice by a licensed professional that seeks or purports to impose change of an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity. Such term--
- 24 (1) Includes practices
- 25 (A) to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity.
- 26 (2) Does not include practices
- 27 (A) to provide acceptance, support, and understanding of an individual's sexual 28 orientation, gender identity, or gender expression and the facilitation of an individual's coping,

- social support, and identity exploration and development, including interventions to prevent or
 address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual practices.
- 31 (b) Under no circumstances shall a licensed professional advertise for or engage in sexual 32 orientation and gender identity change efforts with a patient less than 18 years of age. Any 33 licensed professional violating this prohibition shall be such subject to discipline by the board, 34 which may include suspension or revocation of license.
- 35 (c) Whoever violates this section shall be considered to have violated section 2 of chapter 36 93A.
- SECTION 2. (a) Subsection (a) of Section 51A of chapter 119 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official addition, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "chapter 233" the following words:-
- or (vi) being subjected to sexual orientation and gender identity change efforts as defined by section 169 of chapter 112
- 42 (b) Section 51A of chapter 119 is further amended in subsection (i) after the word 43 "family." by adding the following words:-
- Any report including licensed professionals engaging in sexual orientation and gender identity change efforts as defined under section 169 of chapter 112 shall be filed within 30 days to the appropriate licensing board for review and possible suspension or revocation of license.
