In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to Lyme Disease treatment coverage.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby amended
2 by inserting, after section 218, the following new sections:

3 SECTION 219. Every individual or group hospital or medical expense insurance policy
4 or individual or group hospital or medical services plan contract delivered, issued for delivery or
5 renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2010, shall provide for Lyme disease treatment.

6 SECTION 220. Every individual or group hospital or medical expense insurance policy
7 or individual or group hospital or medical services plan contract delivered, issued for delivery or
8 renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2010, shall provide coverage for diagnostic testing
9 and long-term antibiotic treatment of chronic Lyme disease when determined to be medically
10 necessary and ordered by a physician after making a thorough evaluation of the patient's
11 symptoms, diagnostic test results and response to treatment. Treatment otherwise eligible for
12 benefits pursuant to this section shall not be denied solely because such treatment may be
13 characterized as unproven, experimental, or investigational in nature. Provided, however, this
14 section shall not apply to insurance coverage providing benefits for:

15 Hospital confinement indemnity;

- 16 Disability income;
- 17 Accident only;
- 18 Long-term care;
- 19 Medicare supplement;
- 20 Limited benefit health;
- 21 Specified disease indemnity;
- 22 Sickness or bodily injury or death by accident or both; and
- 23 Other limited benefit policies.

24 Section 221. Subscribers to any health maintenance organization plan shall be afforded
25 coverage under that plan on or after January 1, 2010 for diagnostic testing and long term
26 antibiotic treatment of chronic Lyme disease when determined to be medically necessary and
27 ordered by a physician after making a thorough evaluation of the patient's symptoms, diagnostic
28 test results and response to treatment. Treatment otherwise eligible for benefits pursuant to this
29 section shall not be denied solely because such treatment may be characterized as unproven,
30 experimental, or investigational in nature.
