An Act ensuring access to line-drying.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 21E the following section:-
- 3 Section 21F.
- 4 (a) As used in this section, the following words shall have the following meanings:
- 5 "Legal instrument", a municipal ordinance, bylaw or regulation; a rule, bylaw or
- 6 regulation of an association of property owners; a deed restriction, restrictive covenant, contract
- 7 or similar binding agreements.
- 8 "Solar clothes-drying device", a clothesline, drying rack or other equipment used for
- 9 solar drying of clothing.

- 10 (b) In a city or town which accepts this section, no legal instrument shall unreasonably prohibit
- 11 the installation or use of solar clothes-drying devices on residential property, except as necessary
- 12 to protect public health and safety.
- 13 (c) This section shall not apply to condominium common areas and facilities as defined in
- 14 section 1 of chapter 183a.
