An Act relative to crimes relating to distribution of controlled substances causing death.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 94C of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 32N the  
2 following section:-

3 Section 32O. (a) A person who, while in the course of trafficking or unlawfully  
4 distributing a controlled substance as defined in section 32E, knowingly or intentionally  
5 manufactures, distributes, dispenses, delivers, gives away, barter, administers or provides any  
6 amount of a controlled substance or counterfeit substance which results in death shall be  
7 punished as murder in the second degree as defined by section 1 of chapter 265.

8 (b) Lack of knowledge of a previous health condition shall not be a defense to a violation  
9 of this section.
