The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to authorize the dispensing of compounded prescriptions for office and institutional settings without patient- specific prescriptions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary
- 2 licensed pharmacies, either within the Commonwealth, or other state jurisdictions, holding
- 3 current accreditation from the Pharmacy Compounding Accreditation Board, may compound and
- 4 distribute pharmaceutical mixtures pursuant to a valid order by a licensed practitioner, or
- 5 licensed health care facility to meet the immediate needs of patients under the care of such
- 6 providers. Such products shall be made available in quantities to meet the anticipated needs of
- 7 patients to assure continuity and access for medications as identified by the health care provider
- 8 or facility.
- 9 Notwithstanding, products provided in this manner shall not require traditional
- 10 prescription labeling or patient-specific information, but shall be able to be validated within the
- 11 pharmacy record keeping system, as to permit trailing and validation of such products as to
- 12 standard practices required and validated during the pharmacy accreditation process.
