An Act increasing recycling by landlords and tenants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 8H of chapter 40 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the second paragraph the following
- 3 paragraph:—
- 4 Any recycling program established pursuant to this section shall require all owners of an
- 5 apartment building having three or more units and any condominium association consisting of
- 6 three or more units to provide the means and materials necessary to allow tenants or owners in
- 7 those units to recycle those recyclables designated by the local legislative body in the manner
- 8 determined by the city, town, or district recycling program established pursuant to this section.
