An Act relative to tethering of dogs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 174E of chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in section
- 2 48 of chapter 193 of the acts of 2012, is hereby amended by striking out, in section (a), the words
- 3 "24 consecutive hours," and inserting in place thereof the following words: "5 hours in a 24
- 4 hour period."
- 5 SECTION 2. Said section 174E of chapter 140 of the General Laws, is hereby amended
- 6 by striking out, in section (d), the words "24 consecutive hours," and inserting in place thereof
- 7 the following words: "5 hours in a 24 hour period."
- 8 SECTION 3. Said section 174E of chapter 140 of the General Laws, is hereby amended
- 9 by striking out, in section (g), the words "for a second offense, be punished by a fine of not more
- 10 than \$100 and for a third or subsequent offense, be punished by a fine of not more than \$300,"

- 11 and inserting in place thereof the following words: "for a second offense, be punished by a fine
- 12 of not more than \$200 and for a third or subsequent offense, be punished by a fine of not more
- 13 than \$500,".
