AN ACT RELATIVE TO CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR CERTAIN UNCOMPENSATED DEPUTY PROBATION OFFICERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority
of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 89A of chapter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2000
2 Official Edition, shall hereby be amended by inserting at the end thereof the following
3 paragraph: -- Subject to the provisions and limitations of sections one to twenty-eight,
4 inclusive, of chapter thirty-two, any member in service of a retirement system established under
5 said sections, shall be credited with all service rendered by him as a deputy probation officer
6 under this section; provided that before any retirement allowance becomes effective for him, he
7 pays into the annuity savings fund of such system, with buyback interest as defined in said
8 sections, in one sum, or in installments, upon such terms and conditions as the board managing
9 such system may prescribe, an amount equal to that which would have been withheld as regular
10 deductions from the minimum annual salary payable to a probation officer of said court during
11 the period that such member in service or person so retired served as such deputy probation
12 officer.
