## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act further clarifying dog bite liability.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 155 of Chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the
- 3 following sentence:- If any dog shall do any damage to either the body or property of any person,
- 4 the owner or keeper or, if the owner or keeper is a minor, the parent or guardian of such minor,
- 5 shall be liable for such damage unless such damage shall have been occasioned to the body or
- 6 property of a person who, at the time such damage was sustained, was committing a trespass or
- 7 other tort or was teasing, tormenting or abusing such dog or unless the injured person was
- 8 grossly negligent.
