Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is 1 hereby amended by striking out section 184A and inserting the following new section:-

3 There shall be in the executive office of public safety and security a forensic sciences 4 advisory board, hereinafter called the board, which shall advise the secretary on all aspects of the administration and delivery of criminal forensic sciences in the commonwealth. The board shall 6 consist of the undersecretary for forensic sciences, who shall also serve as chairperson of the board, the attorney general, the colonel of the state police, the president of the Massachusetts 8 Chiefs of Police Association, the president of the Massachusetts Urban Chiefs Association, the president of the Massachusetts District Attorney's Association, a district attorney designated by 10 the Massachusetts District Attorney's Association, the Secretary of the Executive Office of 11 Public Safety and Security and the Chief Counsel of the Committee for Public Counsel Services. 12 or their respective designees, three scientists, experienced in delivery, management or oversight of scientific services, one of whom shall be a forensic scientist with practical experience in an accredited crime lab, one of whom shall have a specialty in the natural or biological sciences and

recommendation of the Massachusetts Bar Association and Boston Bar Association. The 18 members shall serve without compensation, except that, with respect to the three scientists, reasonable travel expenses may be paid for the purpose of attending meetings. Each appointed member shall serve for a term of three years or until a successor is appointed and qualified, whichever is longer. The board shall meet no less than quarterly and as otherwise convened by

one of whom shall have a specialty in the physical sciences, and two members of the bar with

experience in criminal practice and forensic science issues, one each to be appointed on

the undersecretary. The board shall coordinate its responsibilities with the medico-legal 23 investigation commission and shall not infringe upon the commission's authority as established in section 184 of this chapter.

At the direction of the board, the undersecretary for forensic sciences shall advise the board on the administration and delivery of forensic services in the commonwealth. The undersecretary shall include in his report information as the board requests, including but not limited to the volume of forensic services required for each county, including costs and the

29 length of time from submission for testing or procedures and return of results; the 30 capacity of the commonwealth's forensic services and funding requirements; the accreditation of forensic facilities and training of personnel; facilities expansion, including location and funding 32 for a new state police crime lab; and partnerships with other public and private forensic services. 33 The undersecretary shall make recommendations for the allocation of resources and expansion of 34 services, and on an annual basis, submit budget recommendations to the secretary of public 35 safety and security and the board.
