*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of chapter 112 of the General Laws, is amended by inserting, after paragraph 7  
2 the following:- Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, if a registered  
3 physician is convicted of 3 cases of medical malpractice the board shall revoke said physician's  
4 registration.
