**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act to create a CT task force.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There shall be a special task force to conduct an investigation and study
2 concerning optimal and safe use of computed tomography (CT). The task force shall consist of 3
3 members of the senate, one of whom shall be the senate chair of the joint committee on public
4 health, and one of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader; 3 members of the house of
5 representatives, one of whom shall be the house chair of the joint committee on public health,
6 and one of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader; the director of the Massachusetts
7 radiation control program or designee; and 9 persons to be appointed by the governor: 3 of whom
8 shall be radiologists licensed to practice in Massachusetts, one of whom shall have at least five
9 years of experience working at a an academic medical center or teaching hospital, one of whom
10 shall have at least five years of experience working at an acute care hospital other than an
11 academic medical center or teaching hospital, and one of whom shall have at least five years of

12 experience working with a patient population of whom at least 50 percent are under the age of
13 18; 3 of whom shall be CT technicians, one with between one and five years of experience, one
14 with more than 10 years of experience, and one with at least 3 years of experience working at a
15 dental facility or with a patient population of whom at least 50 percent are under the age of 18; 3
16 of whom shall be representatives of companies with a principal office in the commonwealth that
17 manufacture CT equipment or produce software for CT equipment and who shall also have
18 expertise in imaging physics or CT protocol development or implementation; and one of whom
19 shall be a representative of a patient advocacy organization.

20 SECTION 2. The task force shall make recommendations on optimal CT scan dosages
21 for diagnostic procedures, including frequency and distribution of the dose, , using data collected
22 by the department of public health's radiation control program, as well as other sources; provide
23 guidance to Massachusetts state and local agencies and public and private health care facilities
24 and providers on radiation dose optimization; design a mandatory education curriculum on CT
25 scan practices and radiation dose optimization for appropriate staff in Massachusetts health care
26 facilities; evaluate the certification and/or licensure requirements for medical professionals
27 whose responsibilities include CT scans, including dosimetrists, medical physicists, and
28 radiation therapists; develop a plan for maintaining an emphasis on innovation to reduce
29 radiation exposure while optimizing image quality for diagnostic procedures ; and make
30 recommendations on oversight by the radiation control program or other agency or commission.
31 The task force shall review information issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration
32 concerning best practices for CT scans, as well as recommendations from professional medical
33 organizations and individuals and the CT manufacturing sector. Appointed members of the

34 commission shall not be considered special state employees for the purpose of compliance with
35 chapter 268A.

36 The special task force shall submit a report to the governor, the speaker of the house of
37 representatives, the senate president, and the legislative members of the joint committee on
38 public health, setting forth the task force findings, recommendations and proposals, by
39 December 31, 2018. The special task force shall dissolve upon completion of its duties and
40 obligations, as indicated by submission of its findings and recommendations, unless the General
41 Court, in advance of that date, extends its term for a set period or indefinitely.
