An Act relative to non-compete agreements for veterinarians.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 official edition, is hereby  
2 amended by adding the following section:-

3 Section 59B. Any contract or agreement which creates or establishes the terms of a  
4 partnership, employment, or any other form of professional relationship with a veterinarian  
5 registered to practice veterinary medicine pursuant to section 55 of this chapter, which includes  
6 any restriction of the right of such veterinarian to practice veterinary medicine in any geographic  
7 area for any period of time after the termination of such partnership, employment or professional  
8 relationship shall be void and unenforceable with respect to said restriction; provided, however,  
9 that nothing herein shall render void or unenforceable the remaining provisions of any such  
10 contract or agreement.
