The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to the safety of Autistic and Alzheimer's individuals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION __. For the purposes of this section, “technology-assisted tracking device”
2 shall mean any wearable device that: (i) is waterproof and able to function under water; (ii) is
3 compliant with IP66 and IP68 standards; (iii) is operational indoors or under cover; (iv) does not
4 require direct line of sight to the sky; (v) is independent of third-party public communication
5 networks, cellular, GSM, GPRS or similar; (vi) includes a tamper-resistant wrist or ankle strap
6 directly changeable by a caregiver; (vii) includes system specifics to avoid false alarms in order
7 not to avoid unnecessary law enforcement search and rescue efforts; and (viii) has a patient
8 specific code to avoid mistaken identities.

9 The Prevention and Wellness Advisory Board, established under section 2H of chapter
10 111 of the General Laws, shall make recommendations to the department of public health on the
11 use of technology-assisted tracking devices to mitigate risks associated with wandering for

12 certain populations including, but not limited to, individuals with dementia, autism spectrum
13 disorder or Alzheimer's disease.

14 The advisory board shall also review and make recommendations on ways to incorporate
15 the use of technology-assisted tracking devices into a pilot program funded through the
16 Prevention and Wellness Trust Fund, established under section 2G of chapter 111 of the General
17 Laws to increase the safety of individuals with dementia, autism spectrum disorder or
18 Alzheimer's disease.

19 The advisory board shall provide its recommendations to the department not later than
20 December 1, 2018. The department shall forward the board's recommendations and a summary
21 of action items the department intends to undertake as a result of the board's recommendations to
22 the clerks of the senate and house of representatives, the house and senate chairs of the joint
23 committee on public health and the senate and house committees on ways and means not later
24 than December 1, 2018.
