## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to psychotropic medication.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 140 of Chapter 165 of the Massachusetts General Laws as so appearing in the
- 2 2014 Official Edition is hereby amended:
- Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c) a facility may administer a scheduled
- 4 psychotropic medication without prior written informed consent in the following instances, (i) in
- 5 the case of an admission of a resident to a facility from an inpatient hospital in which the
- 6 resident had been prescribed and was receiving psychotropic medications pursuant to a valid
- 7 informed consent, or when a facility is not able to obtain an informed consent in writing prior to
- 8 or at the time of admission to the facility or (ii) in emergency situations, as defined by the
- 9 Department of Public Health; or (iii) in the case of residents on hospice care who need the

immediate administration of psychotropic medication to prevent extreme distress, discomfort and /or pain; provided, however, that in instances in (i) or (ii), a facility shall obtain verbal informed consent prior to administration, and written informed consent as soon as practicable, but no later than 3 consecutive calendar days, following administration of a scheduled psychotropic medication. If written informed consent cannot be obtained within the three-day period the dosage shall be reduced in a clinically appropriate manner and documented to terminate the psychotropic medication."
