**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act to require the disclosure of lead in water pipes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 197A of chapter 111 of General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after the word “plaster”, in lines 2 and 83, the
3 following words “, plumbing and water piping, including water service lines,”.

4 SECTION 2. Said section 197A of said chapter 111, as so appearing, is hereby amended
5 by inserting, after the word “plaster”, in lines 35, the following words “plumbing and water
6 piping, including water service lines,”.
