An Act regarding the pediatric palliative care program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: Section 24K of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the following words:- "subject to

3 appropriation".

4 SECTION 2: Section 24K of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020

5 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the figure "19" and inserting in place thereof

6 the following figure:- "22".

- 7 SECTION 3: Section 24K of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 8 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the following words:- "The program
- 9 established by this section shall not give rise to enforceable legal rights in any party or an

- 10 enforceable entitlement to the services described in this section and nothing stated in this section
- 11 shall be construed as giving rise to such enforceable legal rights or such enforceable
- 12 entitlement", and inserting in place thereof the following words:-" All eligible children shall
- 13 have access to these services. The department shall report caseload information and spending
- 14 projections quarterly to the House and Senate Ways and Means Committees".
