By Mr. Timilty, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1368) of James E. Timilty, Diana DiZoglio, Chris Walsh, Marc T. Lombardo and other members of the General Court for legislation to regulate the closure of state correctional facilities. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act regulating the closure of state correctional facilities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. As used in this act, the following words shall have the following meanings
- 2 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.
- 3 "Institution," Massachusetts State Correctional Facilities
- 4 "Member communities:" communities under the jurisdiction of Massachusetts
- 5 Department of Corrections.
- 6 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the Massachusetts
- 7 Department of Corrections located in the towns hosting a state institution shall continue
- 8 operation until such time that the following are completed:
- a) A study on the public safety impacts of closing institution on member communities

10	b) A cost analysis of the closing, to include the financial impacts on the member
11	communities
12	c) A thorough appraisal of the building, land and structures on the property including the
13	yearly maintenance costs associated with each
14	d) A public hearing in the town hosting a state institution
15	e) A public hearing state house
16	SECTION 3. A report of the study and analysis shall be submitted to the Senate
17	President, the Speaker of the House, and the Senators and Representatives of member
18	communities no later than two years after the passage of this legislation.
19	SECTION 4. No state correctional facilities shall be closed without prior notification to
20	the legislature.
