**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court  
(2017-2018)**

An Act exempting certain positions in the police department of the town of Millis from the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, all future Police  
2 Officer positions within the police department of the Town of Millis shall be exempt from  
3 chapter 31 of the General Laws.

4 SECTION 2. Section 1 shall not impair the civil service status of any Police Officer  
5 employed in the Town of Millis on the effective date of this act.

6 SECTION 3. This revocation shall not affect any contractual or civil service rights which  
7 have come into existence between the town and any employee of the Police Department as a  
8 result of original acceptance.

9 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
