AN ACT REGARDING SERVICE OUTAGE RESTORATION PENALTIES. .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 164 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 1H the following new section:-
- 3 Section 1I. The department is hereby authorized to promulgate rules and regulations to establish
- 4 standards of acceptable performance for the restoration of service outages for distribution,
- 5 transmission and gas distribution companies doing business in the commonwealth. The
- 6 department shall establish a penalty of not less than \$500,000 for each separate instance for a
- 7 failure to perform and the department may increase the penalty should it find it necessary based
- 8 on the severity as a result of the failure to perform. The department shall open a full
- 9 investigation and evidentiary hearings, upon petition of the Attorney General or by any
- municipality that has service outages, to determine whether the distribution, transmission or gas
- distribution company's service outage violated the standards established by the department;
- provided, that said petition shall be made within 45 days after service has been restored.
