**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to the definition of podiatry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 112 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by striking out section 13, as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the
3 following section:-

4 Section 13. (a) As used in this chapter, "podiatry" shall mean the diagnosis and treatment,
5 by medical, mechanical, electrical or surgical means, of ailments of the human foot and lower
6 leg.

7 (b) As used in sections 12B, 12G and 80B, "physician" shall include a podiatrist
8 registered under section 16.

9 (c) Sections 13 to 18, inclusive, shall not apply to surgeons of the United States army,
10 United States navy or of the United States Public Health Service or to physicians registered in
11 the commonwealth.
