**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to collective bargaining.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 150E of the general laws is hereby amended by
2 deleting from the first sentence of the definition of “employee” the words “...and the officers
3 and employees within the departments of the state secretary, state treasurer, state auditor and
4 attorney general.”

5 Section 1 of chapter 150E of the general laws is hereby further amended by adding a new
6 sentence at the end of the definition of “employer” to read “In the case of employees of the state
7 secretary, state treasurer, state auditor and attorney general, the employer shall be the state
8 secretary, state treasurer, state auditor and attorney general respectively.”
