An Act restoring the retirement rights of certain employees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section three of  
2 chapter 32 of the General Laws or any other special or general law to the contrary, any criminal  
3 identification officer, first assistant criminal identification officer, or assistant criminal  
4 identification officer employed by the Plymouth County Sheriff’s Department’s Bureau of  
5 Investigation, who was classified as Group 4 under the Plymouth County Retirement System  
6 prior to the transfer of said sheriff’s department to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall  
7 retain their Group 4 classification in the Massachusetts State Retirement System for the purposes  
8 of said chapter thirty-two.
