In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to elevator certification fees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

- 1 Section 65 of chapter 143 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:-
- 3 Should the owner or operator of the elevator contract another entity for the purpose of
- 4 maintaining the quality of the elevator, all fines due to expired certification shall be assessed to
- 5 the contracted entity.
